


On Tuesday 25th,

Some examples of birds that we saw were: robins, crows, black birds... and we heard a cuckoo.




ESPINOSA DE LOS MONTEROS

We did an experiment and we found out that the rock had the following features: beige, sparkling, tough, tenacious, hard, acid, permeable, and it had little pieces of quartz.






When we returned to the hostel, we found some beautiful horses. We went to caress them. And they were happy about it!
